Our Services and Programs

Our offerings grow and change as we work to best serve our clients and adapt to changing needs in our community. Read on for a full list of our services and programs in 2023, and do give us a call if you're interested in any of our offerings.

OBVS Services

Drives

Volunteer drivers offer transportation assistance for medical appointments, recreational activities, errands, and shopping.

Visits

Whether chatting over tea or playing a friendly game of cards, clients have the opportunity to connect with a caring volunteer for weekly visits in the client's home.

Walks in Community

A weekly social walk or wheelchair push with a volunteer promotes active aging and a connection to community.

Technology Support

Clients who need some help learning to use a device or installing software can access the support of a technology volunteer.

Document Assistance

Document assistance volunteers can help a client fill out forms and other documents.

Minor Home Repairs

A volunteer can provide minor household repairs should a client not have the financial means for a paid handyperson.

Gardening

Our volunteers with green thumbs can help maintain a client's garden or lawn on a one-time or short-term basis should the individual not have financial means for a paid gardener.

Social and Reassurance Phone Calls

Social calls link a client with a volunteer for a weekly connection from the comfort of a client's home. Reassurance phone calls may also be set up for a quick daily phone call to help ensure the health and safety of a client who lives alone.

Packing and Sorting

Our new packing and sorting service will offer assistance to clients with a minor organizing job, such as packing a box of donations or helping organize a desk drawer.

Destination Walks

Our clients can request a volunteer to walk with them to and from a nearby medical appointment, shopping errand, or recreational activity.

Cultural Companion

Through our new cultural companion service, clients can call in to be matched with a volunteer to enjoy a performance together or visit a local gallery or museum.
